

Woodcarving knives

Erik Frost is Mora of Sweden's woodcarving knife brand. It is a well known and appreciated precision tool that is used by wood carvers in Nusnäs, for example. This is where one of Sweden's most recognized national symbols – the Dala Horse – is carved.



Erik Frost 120 and 106 – woodcarving knives with a thin, tapered blade of laminated steel. Oiled birchwood handle. Blade lengths of 49 mm (120) and 82 mm (106). Plastic sheath.



Erik Frost 105 – large woodcarving knife with a thin, tapered blade of laminated steel. Oiled birchwood handle. Blade length 79 mm. Comes with a sheath.



Erik Frost 73/164 – woodcarving knife for children. Has ordinary finger protection. Carbon steel blade. Oiled birchwood handle. Blade length 75 mm. Plastic sheath.



Erik Frost 162 – hook knife for spoon carving. Double-edged. Carbon steel blade. Oiled birchwood handle. Blade length 52 mm. Comes without a sheath.



Erik Frost 163 – hook knife for spoon carving. Double-edged. Carbon steel blade. Oiled birchwood handle. Blade length 61 mm. Comes without a sheath.



Erik Frost 164 – hook knife for spoon carving. Single-edged. Carbon steel blade. Oiled birchwood handle. Blade length 52 mm. Comes without a sheath.



Erik Frost 920 and 906 – woodcarving knives with a thin, tapered blade of laminated steel. Plastic handle. Blade lengths of 53 mm (920) and 82 mm (906). Plastic sheath.



Erik Frost wood splitting knife 220 – oiled birchwood handle. Triflex steel blade. Blade length 106 mm.



Mora Diamondsharpener – L Fine – a fine (600) diamond sharpener that is the obvious choice for keeping your woodcarving knife in good repair. Simple to use. The flat steel easily follows the angle of the edge.
